DO NOWT AND YOU GET NOWT!

Geoff Brown, 'The Local Bore, You can't Ignore,' writes: I've known from an awful childhood experience that gambling could cause problems. However, I'd no concept of just how much of a problem so many suffered today and it's awesome scale - truly frightening! Recovering gambling addict and now campaigner, Tony Franklin told 'The Bore' last week, "Our high streets are now packed with bookmakers and others, offering Fixed Odds Betting Terminals, fruit machines based around the roulette model where we're able to lose £100 with a single spin - in reality, every 20 seconds or £3,500 an hour, an entire month's wages for me in those desperate days. "Call me extreme if you like," he went on to say but "I firmly believe they should be illegal!" Tony's lost numerous jobs, two properties and at one stage amassed nearly £500,000 of debt. He's now unable to rent a home as landlords won't look at him past his credit scoring and he hasn't the cash for a deposit. Whilst admitting we're not all addicted, for those who find the 'buzz' provided as a potential 'fix,' getting that 'fix' is all too easy! The Gambling Commission, to their credit, recently fined 888 Holdings a record £7.8million for failing to protect their vulnerable customers. However, Sarah Harrison, their chief executive told me that they were currently introducing a 'self exclusion' scheme where problem punters can have access to bookmakers, casinos and online companies to have access denied them. It sounds honourable but I think the buck stops with the Gambling Commission themselves for allowing such unscrupulous 'outfits' to be even granted a licence to operate, especially as only two years ago the industry netted the Government nearly £8 billion in taxes! I'm no 'Killjoy,' am happy for people to bet a 'few bob,' just as, as a recovering alcoholic, am happy for folks to enjoy a drink 'sensibly' but we must be made aware of the dangers! **AN HOUR SHARED IS AN HOUR SPARED!**
