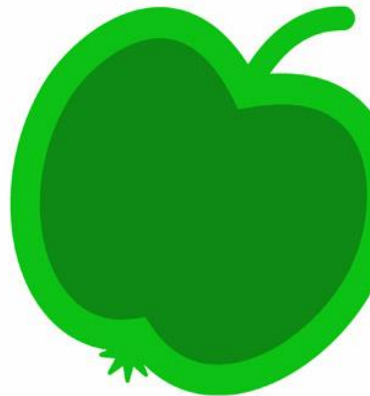

Don't Dump It – Recycle It, For Free

An unwanted three-piece suite costs £40 to get the City Council to dispose of. Rather than pay this, some residents may choose instead to dump it in the back lane.

There is a solution however and it's free.

Providing the suite is in decent condition, the **Community Furniture Service** will take it away. It also takes other good condition furniture and household items. It then sells the items cheaply to local residents from its Mill Lane industrial unit base, behind the Asda store. Contact them through freephone on 0800 731 3096.

The **West End Refugee Service** also takes clothing, bedding, toys, kitchen equipment and bric-a-brac. Contact 0191 273 7482.

Time Exchange, of course, is always happy to act as a broker for those wanting to get rid of items and those who might like items being got rid of.

Alternatively, there are sites like **Gumtree**, **Freecycle**, **Freecycle** and **Streetlife** which allow people to get rid of unwanted household goods.

DO NOWT AND YOU GET NOWT!

Geoff Brown, 'The Local Bore, You can't ignore,' writes: Last week I received a call from local M.P. Ronnie Campbell, before his surgery and impending chemotherapy for stomach cancer. However, whilst worried, he was also excited, as he told me that the fines and penalty points for using mobile phones whilst driving were soon set to be doubled!

It was the same guy who introduced the ban as a Private Member's Bill in 2003 but since then, motorists are increasingly ignoring it. A survey by the RAC last week reported that nearly a third of motorists admitted to texting or calling whilst behind the wheel. Department of Transport Figures show it played a major factor in hundreds of accidents every year, 21 of which proved fatal! I managed to track down Transport Secretary, Chris Grayling and he told me, "It may seem harmless as you answer a call or send a text message but the truth is your actions could cause untold misery and even death, to others!" I put it to the Minister, that perhaps the penalties weren't harsh enough but he went on to let me know, "Newly qualified drivers could have their licences revoked and people offending for a second time will go to court, face fines of up to a £1,000 and driving ban of at least six months."

In my own view, many of us don't drive and as pedestrians, cyclists, or wheelchair users, could be even more at risk! This view was backed, understandably, by Nazan Fennell, whose daughter, Hope, was killed by a lorry driver texting his girlfriend, as she made her way home from school. Whilst still saddened by her loss, she told 'The Bore, "The issue needs to be tackled in the same way as smoking has over the last few years and be seen as anti - social, as the penalties just aren't working!" A brave lady and all I can add to that is: If you're out and about, watch out!
